## **RULING**

The Defendant/Applicant's application, yet again dated 25/01/2022 is for:

1) An Order of this Court admitting the Defendant/Applicant to bail on health grounds.

And for such further Orders as the Court may deem fit to make in the circumstances.

The Applicant was aforetime granted bail but was revoked when he was arrested at the Airport allegedly attempting to flee the country.

The Applicant failed to appeal against the Ruling or file

a similar application in the Court of Appeal. This Court

will not want to approbate and reprobate.

In this Court, day cannot suddenly become night. The

circumstances that led to the revocation of the

Applicant's bail has not changed.

This application is an abuse of Court process. It is

accordingly struck out.

I grant an Order for accelerated hearing.
